The first seventy-two hours of nuclear fallout are critical for health. But that is the very time when information is most scarce. Now, the British Isles' only independent radiation monitoring network is offering a unique service. Within ten minutes of radiation levels' exceeding background by 40%, you can receive e-mail alerts until radiation levels return to normal. Unfortunately, this service is not available via a web-site, since during a nuclear emergency, it would be swamped.
