<u>Is there anyone left who thinks this unsustainable Hinkley Point C nuclear project is a good idea?</u>

Following the latest remarks from a retired nuclear scientist that Hinkley Point C is the wrong design and too expensive, (1) the Stop Hinkley Campaign asks "how many more attacks on the proposals will it take before the Government and EDF finally call a halt?"

Stop Hinkley spokesperson, Roy Pumfrey said:

"The critical comments have been coming thick and fast over the past few years—including from utility chiefs, City analysts, the Chancellor's father-in-law and a former Tory Chancellor. How many more nuclear supporters have to stand up against this scheme, which has left the City flabbergasted, before the Government and EDF do the sensible thing and call a halt to this ludicrously expensive deal?"

"Apart from DECC civil servants stuck in their (nuclear) bunker in Whitehall, Government Ministers with their heads in the sand and EDF bosses up their ivory tower in Paris, is there anyone left who thinks Hinkley Point C is a good idea?"
